

In 2011, this dream of taking a unique scholarship program to other states is being realized. There are now ASPIRE affiliates in Missouri, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Mississippi and Georgia! ASPIRE also administers an inspiring scholarship program for widows of servicemen killed in Afghanistan and Iraq, with recipients in Texas and Colorado. With the recent addition of a Program Coordinator to better serve our members, we are on our way!

We express special thanks to Christine Zini and Pete Metzger who stepped out in 2008 to co-found the program; to the Walton Family Foundation for the original seed grant; and the other donors and supporters who have made this progress possible.

The first year was foundation building, developing the 501(c)3, bylaws, and organizational and developmental materials for affiliates. The first affiliate, ASPIRE of Southwest Missouri in Joplin, awarded scholarships in 2010, and despite a devastating tornado, also awarded scholarships in Fall 2011. Oklahoma's first affiliate in Tulsa (GCOK) has awarded scholarships as well. As we approach the end of 2011, the dream of a nationwide program is becoming a reality. Thank you donors, staff, Board members and most of all, community leaders who are giving leadership, time, energy and finances to develop local programs to enhance communities by changing the lives of single parent families through education.

Surviving Spouse Recipient... Donnice Roberts

May 7, 2008 was the day my life changed forever. My husband, SSG Kevin Casey Roberts, was killed in Afghanistan during his third tour of duty. At the age of 28 I became a widow. With two young kids, I began worrying about the future immediately. I was a homemaker and my life had been taking care of my family, but now the dynamics of the situation had changed. When looking to the future, the only option I had was that I would need to go back to school and get a college education. Failure would not be an option! With the rising cost of education I was unsure of how I was going to be able to achieve this dream without going into debt with school loans.

Luckily, I am one of the recipients of the ASPIRE and BAE Systems, Inc. scholarships for military widows. Without this scholarship I would not be able to attend school and further my education. This scholarship has given me hope that I can accomplish anything and that there is a good future to be had by myself and my children. Now my kids will know that even through tragedy you can rise above and persevere. I am setting a good example for them while carrying on the legacy of my husband. With my education, which is made possible by the Surviving Spouse Scholarship, I plan on working with Veterans and their families as well as Gold Star families. Giving back to our military community will be in honor of my husband and will fulfill my educational goals. Thank you to ASPIRE and BAE for walking hand in hand on this journey with me and believing in me and my dream to succeed.
