

News from aspire: assisting single parents in realizing education

Update on ASPIRE of Southwest Missouri

"Were you affected?" That is a question heard quite regularly in Joplin, Missouri since an EF-5 tornado ripped through town on May 22, 2011. Not everyone was physically affected by the loss of health, home, cars, or possessions. But, everyone in the city of Joplin was affected mentally and emotionally. Getting lost in a town you've lived in for 25 years because there are no street signs and no visible landmarks affects you. Spending three hours being rerouted on the phone to track down the pediatrician to schedule a routine physical for your child to attend summer camp takes its toll on you.

Thankfully, our ASPIRE organization in Joplin was spared. No current recipients or board members were harmed in the path of the tornado. Of course, everyone knew family or friends who were physically and emotionally affected.

The organization was also spared. Files, paperwork, and office equipment were still intact. But, it was impacted. Our largest (and only) fundraiser and publicity event, the Celebration of Success, was scheduled to take place on June 16th at St. Paul's United Methodist Church. Since the church was severely damaged and everyone in the city needed to focus on tornado recovery, the board felt it best to cancel the event. The publicity and increased community awareness of our program from the event was gone. Almost \$20,000 in funds we had budgeted to raise at the event were lost.

There is a bright side to being affected by the tornado. One of our current recipients, in her last year of college, majoring in Social Work, volunteered for a position with Catholic Charities in disaster case management after the tornado. She said, "After volunteering for a month, [they] hired me on as a permanent employee. They have agreed to work around my schedule during my last semester of classes. I will also be able to do my practicum semester with them. I am so blessed, and the ASPIRE scholarship plays a part in my success. Soon I
